

Edward A. Stone, who died so auddenly in San Francisco, October 5, was a son of Asa and Ann Stone, pioneers nť Clackamas County, Oregon. He was born near Viola, December 24, 1802. He was married to Rose Stewart, of Newport, Tenn., September 29, 1888, who with two little girls is left to mourn his untimely death. leaves three brothers, William M. Stone, of Redland, Or.; Charles G. and Frank W. Stone, of Vancouver, Wash,, and a half-brother and sister, Rev. M. R. Brown, of Spokane, and Mrs. M. J. Hicinbothem, of Goldendale, Wash,

Death Calls Vancouveran

VANCOUVER, Wash., June 7 (Special)—Frank Warren Stone, 77, retired business and newspaper man and a resident of Vancouver for 40 years, died at 5 P. M. Monday at a local hospital where he had been a patient but a day. Death resulted from a hemorrhage. The Stone home is located at 202 E. 17th street.

A son of pioneer parents, he was born in Oregon City, Or. He engaged in the grocery business in Portland for some years and a grocery and fish business here at 5th and Main street. From 1912 to 1918, Mr. Stone was employed as an editorial and news writer by the Vancouver Columbian and during the decade between 1920 and 1930 served as Vancouver correspondent for The Oregonian and News-Telegram in Portland.

Church Life Recalled

During Mr. Stone's residence here he had been a member of the First Methodist church and while living in Portland was a member of the Centenary-Wilbur church.

Survivors include the widow, Gertrude; a son, Edward T., managing editor of the Seattle Post-Intelligencer; two daughters, Mrs. Frances Burns, Wellesley, Mass., feature writer for the Boston Globe; Mrs. Florine DuFresne, wife of the Clark county coroner, Ronald E. DuFresne; a brother, Charles, Oregon City, Or. Funeral arrangements are being completed by the Vancouver Funeral chapel.
