Well Known Boistfort Pioneer Dies

Arthur J. White, who was born at Boistfort, 16 miles southwest of Chehalis, May 29, 1860, died in Chehalis Wednesday night, following an extended period of ill health. Mr. White had spent practicaly all his seventy years as a resident of Lewis His parents were among the county. earliest settlers of the Boistfort prairie district, the family being widely known and highly respected. For a number of years past Mr. White had resided at Chehalis. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mande White, domestic science teacher in the Chehalis Senior high school; a son, Charles White; a daughter, Mrs. Alta Bryan, and seven grandchildren, all of Chehalis. A sister, wife of former State Treasurer Chas. W. Maynard, resides at Olympia; and a brother, Cyrus White, at Redlands, Calif. The body will lie in state at the Fissel Funeral Home where funeral services will be held at 4 o'clock this Friday afternoon. Rev. E. L. Kechley of the Christian church will officiate. Burial will be at Claquato.
