DEATH OF A PIONEER—Mr. J. J. BURTON, one of the earliest settlers of Yamhill county, died on Monday evening of heart disease in this city, where he was temporarily living—his death being the catastrophe of long and intense suffering. With his wife and one or two little children, Mr. Burton arrived in Oregon in 1815 and settled upon a tract of land in the North Yamhill, now known as the "Burton Farm," which has been his home ever since a few months ago. While Mr. Burton's death was commonplace, he was widely known as an honorable citizen and a sincere and good man. His business relations were extensive, and the fine hotel in this city, which bears his name, is a monument to his industry and success. The remains, attended by his family and friends, were taken to Yamhill yesterday for burial. Another of our hardy band who braved the terrors of an unknown country and founded in the wilderness the homes which are ours and the property which we enjoy, is gone.

WAS A PIONEER OF 1844

REMARKABLE CAREER OF MRS.
MARGARET W. BURTON.

Saw the Infancy of Five Countries—
Mother of a Sturdy Pion-
eer Family.

Mrs. Margaret Watson Burton, who died at the home of her son, Henry Heber, in Portland, Thursday afternoon, was an Oregon pioneer of 1844, and a woman with a remarkable career. She and her husband, with three little children arrived at the mouth of the Columbia on the 17th day of March in that year, from New Zealand, via Honolulu, in the American brig Heber. The vessel was nine days sailing up the Columbia, and cast anchor opposite what is now the city of Portland on March 26. So far as is known, Mrs. Burton was the last survivor of that expedition. The family made their headquarters in Captain Silvester's cabin on the east side of the river for several weeks and finally moved up the river near Oregon City. The following August they moved to the Burton donation claim, near which now stands the town of North Yamhill. She resided on the farm 24 years and afterwards moved to Portland, where she lived ten years.

Mrs. Burton was the mother of 15 children, 12 of whom are still living. Henry Heber Burton, a resident of Portland; Doc Ben L., Lenoir and Miss G. Burton, Mrs. Kate B. Lake and Mrs. Lois Anthony, of San Francisco, Mrs. Lizzie Rogers, of Santa Rosa, Cal., Charles W. Burton and Mrs. Alma E. Hawley, of Oakland, Cal., John J. Burton, of Dawson City, E. R. Burton, of North Yamhill, C. Burton, Sheriff of Wahkiakum County, Wash., live to revere her memory. The three who preceded her to the tomb were Misses Amy and Jemima Burton and Mrs. Eliza T. Moore.

Thirty grandchildren, eight great-grandchildren, and a host of relatives in various portions of the world will mourn her loss.

Margaret Watson was born in Lancashire, England, June 21, 1822, and was therefore in her 79th year when she died. She was the youngest child of Charles and Bridget Watson, and with her parents left the old country to become a pioneer of Australia, in 1831. Charles Watson, her father, was superintendent of government works in Australia and in 1834 was sent to Tasmania, where she again became a pioneer at the age of 12. In 1836 she moved with her parents to New Zealand, for the third time becoming the pioneer of a new country.

When but 14 years old she went with her sister and brother-in-law (Captain Carow, father of General Carew of the British Army) and his wife to the Philippine Islands, stopping at Manila. At 15 she was shipwrecked while going from Tasmania to New Zealand and drifted to the East Indies, where they stayed several weeks while the vessel was being repaired.

In New Zealand she married John James Burton, August 14, 1839. In the Fall of the following year Mrs. Burton, with her husband, and two baby girls, started for the Sandwich Islands on the sailing vessel Heber. Near the Marquesas Islands her son, Henry Heber, now of Portland, was born. The family stayed six weeks in Honolulu and then started for the Columbia River, which was reputed to be a land of milk and honey. Her husband died in Portland 21 years ago. Her remains will be laid to rest by his side in the old burial ground near the farm at North Yamhill, this morning at half past ten o'clock. The funeral services will be held in the M. E. church at North Yamhill, the services being conducted by the Rev. J. H. Hoberg, of McMinnville, who has officiated at the marriage and burial of members of her family for 40 years. Mrs. Burton was a member of the Methodist church, an earnest Christian, always gentle and forgiving.

Mrs. Mary F. Burton, a former resident of Portland died in San Jose Saturday, February 14. Mrs. Burton is survived by her husband, Henry H. Burton, and six children: W. J. Davis of North Yakima, Wash.; Mrs. Leona Brown of Willamina, Or.; Mrs. Etta Bartling of Portland, John A. and Harold D. Rhoades of Missouri and Harry E. Barton of San Jose, Cal. Interment was made in the G. A. E. plot of the Oak Hill cemetery.

Henry H. Burton, "G. A. R. Man, Is Dead"

Henry H. Burton, commander of the Sheridan-Dix post No 7 of the G. A. R., passed away this morning at 6 o'clock at his home at 703 Delmar av., after a long illness. Burton was one of the most noted Civil war veterans of this valley. He was born 78 years ago on the U. S. sailing cutter, "Heber," three days out from the Phil islands. He was the eldest of 15 children, six of whom survive him.

He enlisted in the Civil war in 1863 at the age of 18 years, leaving college to do so. He served until the conclusion of the Civil war and later came west to Oregon. In 1912 he came to California and resided at Gilroy until three years ago when he made San Jose his residence. Last December he was married a second time.

The funeral will be held next Thursday under the auspices of the Sheridan-Dix post G. A. R. from the San Jose undertaking parlors. Commander Burton is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary E. Burton, his son, Elmer Burton of San Jose; his step-children, Mrs. Ada Hartling, Mrs. Leona Brown, William Davis, Harold Rhoades and John Rhoades, and by his brothers and sisters, Mrs. Kate B. Lake, Mrs. Marguerite E. Hawley, Edward H. Burton of Portland, Ore. and Lincoln C. Burton of Washington, D. C., and James Burton of the Canal zone.

MRS. D. G. ROGERS DEAD

**NATIVE DAUGHTER OF OREGON
DIES IN SAN FRANCISCO.**

**Husband, Four Sons, Two Daughters,
Six Brothers and Three
Sisters Survive Her.**

Mrs. Dwight G. Rogers, who died at her home at 178 Twenty-third avenue in San Francisco, January 14, was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John James Burton, who came to Oregon from Hobart Town, Tasmania, with Captain Couch's second expedition, crossing the Columbia River bar the morning of March 17, 1844.

Mrs. Rogers was born on the Burton donation claim, near North Yamhill, Or., April 23, 1852, and was married to Dwight G. Rogers in 1870, living at Lafayette, Or., until 1891, when she moved to Portland. She took up her home in San Francisco in 1895.
