

"Died at his residence at Jacksonville on morning of September 18<sup>th</sup>, John S. Love, aged 37 years." [Oregon Sentinel, September 21, 1867 p. 3:3]

"On the morning of the 18<sup>th</sup> John S. Love died after a painful illness. He left a widow and three children. He was a member of the Masonic Brotherhood. His burial took place on Thursday. He was a native of Pennsylvania and emigrated to Oregon in 1853, having been a citizen of Jacksonville since that time." [Oregon Sentinel, September 21, 1867 p. 2:5]

"Executors appointed by the Jackson County Court for the estate of John S. Love are: John S. Drum, David Linn and Anna Sophia Love." [Oregon Sentinel, November 2, 1867 p. 2:6]

"Mrs. John S. Love died this morning at 8:00 from smallpox. She was a woman of inestimable worth. She leaves 4 little children." [Oregon Sentinel, January 16, 1869 p. 2:3]

"Notice is given that as Aaron Chambers has been appointed administrator for Anna Sophia Love, late of Jackson County, all persons having claims against or owing the estate are asked to present claims and or payments to Mr. Chambers' residence in Jackson County." "My people crossed the plains to Oregon in 1853. They came out here to take up land, but every one of my relatives bought squatter's claims. When my brother was eight months old, and I was two or three years old, my father and mother left us with her mother and her sister Agnes while they took my father's mother to her son John, who had a tin shop in Jacksonville. The care of Grandmother Love and the children was too much for Mother. Her son John was not married, so he hired the widow Harris and her daughter, Sophia to keep house for him and to take care of Grandmother Love. John later married Sophia. Their daughter Mary married John Hanley at Jacksonville. Their son George McKay Love married Fanny Dowell, and their other two

children, John and Maggie died of smallpox during the epidemic that took so many lives in Jacksonville." [Interview with Jeanette Love Esterbrook, daughter of David Swan Love done by "the Journal Man", Fred Lockley, Oregon Journal, September 14 and 15, 1927]

LOVE, GEORGE M., a merchant of Jacksonville, was born at that place December 29, 1860, and has always lived there. He is a working Republican and was a delegate to all the county conventions from 1884 to 1892, and the state conventions of 1890, 1892 and 1894. In 1888 he was nominated assessor. He was appointed Postmaster by President Harrison, and served till July 1, 1894.
