Abbott and Sterling Abbott of Eugene, and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Holland of Crow, Or., and Mrs. Dr. Kennedy of Eugene, also survive him.

JOHN D. ABBOTT DIES IN SALEM

Former Eugene Pioneer Who Was Raised Here, Dies at 73 Years of Age.

John D. Abbott, an old Eugene pioneer, died last night in Salem, according to word received here by his brother S. Y. Abbott, of 485 Eighth avenue west. The deceased came to Eugene in 1852 and was virtually raised here. He was known by all the old timers in and about Eugene. He died at the age of 73 years, six months and three days. The funeral will probably be held in Salem, where he was visiting his children.

Mr. Abbott left Eugene 15 years ago and went to Grants Pass. From there he went to Walla Walla and lived 12 years, coming back to Eugene two or three years ago and taking a residence in Fairmount. He went to Salem early in the Spring.

He leaves two sisters, Mrs. Mary Holland, at Crow; and Mrs. S. E. Canady, in Eugene; two brothers, S. W. Abbott, in Eugene; and W. S. Abbott of Crow; a widow, three sens and four daughters in Salem.

Dr. M. Canady, Pioneer Physician of Lane, Dead

Dr. M. Canady, pioneer physician of Lane county, passed away Saturday, afternoon about three o'clock, at the age of 87 years and two months. Dr. Canady came to Oregon in 1852 and has practiced medicine practically the entire time since his arrival, having studied it as a boy.

M. Canady was married in 1857, at Umpqua, Douglas county, but moved to Lane county soon after and lived for years in the neighborhood near Elmira and was the physician of the neighborhood up until he moved to Eugene a few years ago, where he resided on Fifth avenue west for several years. He afterward moved to Crow, where he lived up to the time of his death.

Dr. Canady is survived by his wife, one daughter, Mrs. M. E. Weyer, and one sen, W. H. Canady, both of Crow, and several grandchildren, as well as great grandchildren. Three other children preceded in death the pioneer.

The funeral services were held at Crow with interment in the Gates cemetery, Monday at 11 o'clock, Rev. C. E. Dunham, of the First Baptist church of Eugene, conducting the services.

PIONEER PASSES BEYOND

DR. M. CANADAY, EARLY SET-TLER, DIES NEAR CROW

Born in Ohio and Came to Oregon in 1852 by Ox Team with Father and Brothers

Dr. Madison Canaday, one of the early pioneers of Lane county, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Emma Weyer, near Crow, December 14, at the age of 87 years 7 months and 23 days. Dr. Canaday was born October 21, 1831, near Hillsboro, Highland county, Ohio. When a small boy he moved with his family to Henry county, Iowa, and crossed the plains to this city by ox team in 1852, accompanied by his father, four brothers and two sisters, of whom Mrs. I. F. Rice, of Rice Hill, Douglas county, is the only one now living.

Dr. Canaday was married at Mc-Minnville, Ore., to Sarah E. Abbott, September 20, 1857. To this union five children were born, Henrietta, Walter J., William Henry, Lizzie and Emma. Dr. Canaday was well known to all the old settlers of Eugene, having lived in this city most of the time since 1861, except a number of years spent at Crow. He is survived by his widow, one son, W. H. Canaday and a daughter, Mrs. Emma Weyer.

The funeral was held at the Gates cemetery, near Crow, at 11 a. m. yesterday. Rev. C. E. Dunham, of Eugene, conducted the services in the presence of a large company of friends and neighbors of the pioneer. CANADY—At the home of her daughter, Mrs. Emma Wever, 739 High street, February 27, 1922, Mrs. Sarah Elizabeth Canady, aged 79 years, four months and one day.

Besides her daughter, she leaves a son, W. dl. Canady, of Crow. The funeral will be held from the Branstetter chape! Thursday morning at 10 o'clock. Interment will be at Crow at 2 o'clock i nthe afternoon. Mrs. Canady was the wife of Dr. M. Canady, a former Lane county physician who Gad Care years ago. Both crossed the plains from Missouri in 1852, and were married at McManville in 1857. Shortly afterwards they went to Douglas county, where they lived until coming to Lane county in 1862, where they since resided.

Charlotte (Abbott) Hayes

Mrs. Charlotte Hayes, wife of the late Lewis Hayes, a pioneer of 1852, died at Grant's Pass May 14 last. Mrs. Hayes' maiden name was Charlotte Abbott. She was born in Greene County, Missouri, December 18, 1882, and came to Oregon with her father in 1852, crossing the country from the Missouri River to Oregon with an ox team, which took six months to complete the journey.

She was married to Lewis Hayes at Salem, October 18, 1853. Mrs. Hayes was the mother of nine children: Mrs. Rachel Sparlin (now deceased), Mrs. Lizzie Osborn, F. M. Hayes, J. D. Hayes, Samuel P. Hayes (deceased), Mrs. Josie Ruch, David O. Hayes, William L. Hayes and Ira E. Hayes. All the surviving children are residents of Josephine County except J. D. Hayes, who resides in Portland.

Lewis Hayes and family came to Josephine County in 1865, bought a farm on the Applegate River, in what, at that time, was an unbroken wilderness. The neighbors were four to six miles apart, and the nearest schoolhouse was seven miles distant.

Mrs. Hayes was buried at Williams Creek cemetery, beside her husband, who died August 26, 1904. Many old neighbors and kind friends were present at the funeral.
