### Another Pioneer Gone,

Wm. N. Luckey died at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Wm. Smith, in Eugene, Friday evening, April 15, at 8:30 o'clock, of old age at the advanced age of 84 years, 5 months and 15 days.

He was born near Albany, Ohio, in 1807. With his wife and family he came to Oregon in 1850, locating near Coburg, afterwards moving to a place at Butte Disappointment where he made his home for many years. His wife died Aug. 3, 1886. Since that time he has resided in Eugene with his children, eight of whom survive him.

"Uncle Billy" Luckey was a genial whole-souled citizen, a man of strict probity, esteemed for his good qualities and generous charitable disposition by his neighbors and acquaintances. He was one of those who under hardships laid the foundations of this Pacific commonwealth. His work is finished, and he will rest in the land he helped to build.

The funeral will take place to the Masonic cemetery, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

**Wm. N. Luckey.**

The news of the death of Wm. N. Luckey May 1 came as a shock to the people of Hood River, although it was generally known that the physicians held no hope for his recovery.

The funeral services were held from Nichols' chapel Monday afternoon and a large concourse of friends were

present to pay their last respects to their friend who had been loved by all who knew him.

Rev. W. C. Gilmore, pastor of the Riverside Congregational church, conducted the services and made a few comforting remarks to the mourners.

Interment was made in Idlewild cemetery under the direction of J. E. Nichols. The pall bearers were: S. F. Blythe, Geo. Coe, J. W. Henrick, D. A. Turner, J. H. Dukes and Geo. P. Crowell.

Wm. Luckey was born in 1835 and crossed the plains in 1850 with his father and uncle. They came to The Dalles with loaded wagons and crossed the rapids at Cascades in Indian boats, swimming the horses and cattle over. Later they went to Vancouver, where the family spent the winter on a farm and where Mr. Luckey was in a mine in Lane county. In 1877 the family came to Hood River, and he and his brother, James, built a mill. They were in Southern Oregon three years and six years ago came to Portland and a year ago to Hood River, where he has lived with his son.

He leaves to mourn his loss, J. C. Luckey, of Portland, Wm. and J. J. Luckey, of this city, and Lester and Bessie Luckey, of Portland, besides three daughters and one son in Seattle. The only ones who could attend the funeral were Will and Lester, of Portland.

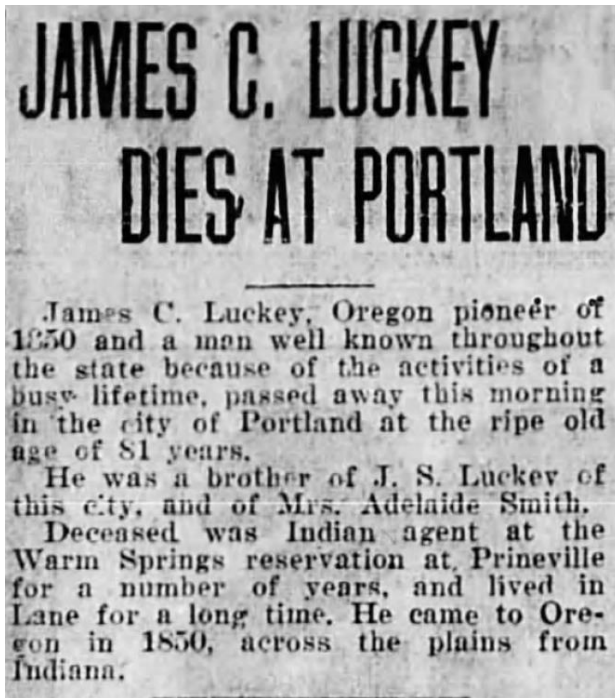
**Mrs. J. C. Luckey Dies in

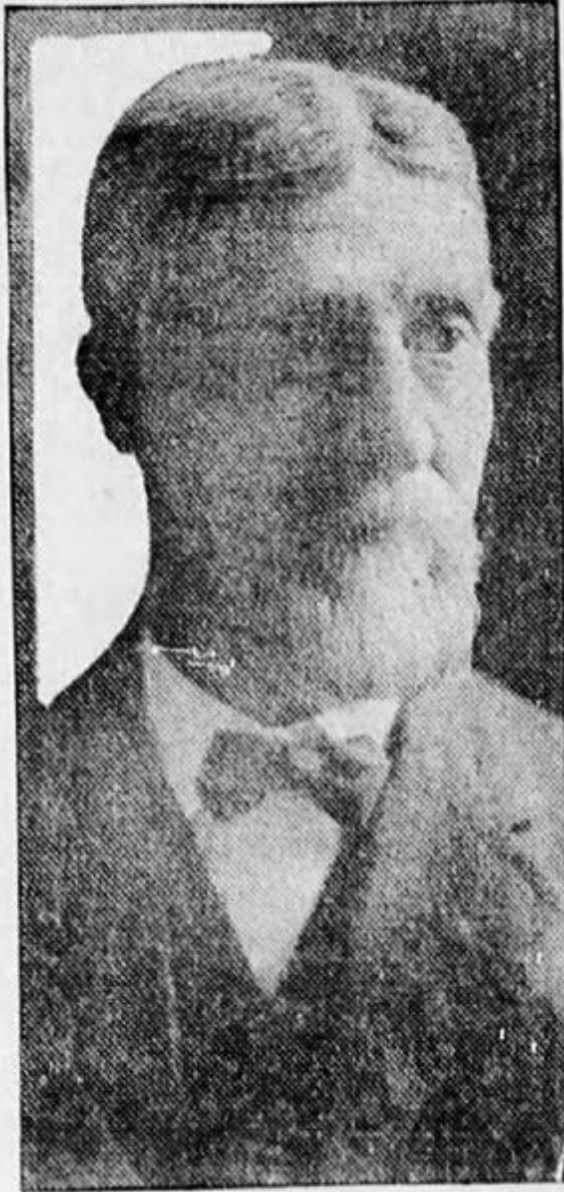

## J. S. LUCKEY, CITY PIONEER, IS DEAD

**Came to Lane County by Ox  
Team in 1850; Funeral  
Set for Friday**

J. S. Luckey "Uncle Joe Luckey," one of Eugene's first pioneers, died Thursday morning at 1:30 o'clock at his home at 985 Pearl street. He passed peacefully away as in sleep. He was 87 years old.

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon, May 1, at 2:30 o'clock at the Ventch chapel. Rev. Milton S. Weber, pastor of Central Presbyterian church, will read the service. Burial will be in the Masonic cemetery.

He was one of Eugene's best known citizens. He came to Lane county in 1850 by ox team with his parents while a six year old boy. He established the Luckey jewelry store, now Bristow's jewelry store, which still bears the original name.

Josiah Speed Luckey was born in Iowa September 20, 1844. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Luckey. The family crossed the plains and settled at what was known as Butte Disappointment. J. S. Luckey spent most of his boyhood near Spencer butte. He attended grade school there and later attended Columbian college on College hill.

He married Lizzie Stewart. She died in 1908. In 1910 he was married to Jennie Spencer.

He ran the jewelry store until 1910. He was a member of the Episcopal church and the I. O. O. F. lodge.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Jennie Luckey, and by two nieces, Miss Bernice Spencer of Eugene and Mrs. A. B. Chaney of Portland.

Although he crossed the plains while only a boy of 6, he had a vivid memory of the events of the crossing, and told many interesting details to friends.

# J. S. LUCKEY RITES HELD HERE FRIDAY

## Many Friends of Pioneer at Services; Burial in Masonic Plot

Funeral services for J. S. Luckey, Eugene pioneer who died Thursday, were held Friday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Veatch chapel.

The ceremony was simple. Rev. Milton S. Weber, pastor of Central Presbyterian church, read the brief service. Mrs. Edna V. Pearson and Mrs. E. E. Wyatt sang "Our God, Our Help in Ages Past."

Rev. Mr. Weber read the twenty-third, or Shepherd's, psalm. He spoke of Mr. Luckey's death, stating that it is nice for a man who has finished his course to pass in sleep, and spoke a few words of comfort to relatives.

Pallbearers were Dr. C. B. Willoughby, P. E. Snodgrass, Darwin Bristow, F. N. McAlister, C. C. Carter and I. T. Nicklin.

The services were attended by many persons of "Uncle Joe" Luckey's large group of friends.

Burial was in the Masonic cemetery.

The old pioneer came to Lane county in 1850 by covered wagon train drawn by oxen. He was one of Eugene's best known citizens.

Many floral pieces were sent by friends.

JOSIAH S. LUCKEY. Among the substantial citizens of Eugene none stands in higher regard than Josiah S. Luckey. He has been identified with the interests of the community for many years and through an extended period was connected with business circles as proprietor of a jewelry store. At present writing, however, he is living retired, having acquired a handsome competency which has enabled him to put aside the more arduous cares of commercial life. He is a native of Iowa, his birth having occurred in Augusta, Des Moines county, September 28, 1846, his parents being William and Elizabeth (Leasure) Luckey. In pioneer times the family was established in Ohio, representatives of the name settling in Marietta where William Luckey was born. When he was fourteen years of age a removal was made to Illinois and later he became a resident of Iowa where he learned and followed the blacksmith trade. In 1850 he made his way to Oregon across the plains with ox teams, braving the dangers and hardships incident to such a trip and

resolutely meeting the difficulties incident to the establishment of a home in the frontier region. The first winter was spent on French prairie but later a removal was made to a farm in the vicinity of Coburg where the father carried on general agricultural pursuits for several years and then located in Eugene where his death occurred.

Josiah S. Luckey was a lad of only five summers at the time the family emigrated from Iowa to Oregon. He pursued his education in the public schools of Eugene and other districts in which he lived and then made his start in the business world by learning the jewelry trade, under the direction of C.H. Moses, the pioneer jeweler of Lane county. He mastered the business in

principle and detail and when he was thoroughly acquainted with the trade started in business on his own account. As his patronage grew he increased his stock and for a long time was owner of a large and well-appointed establishment. He conducted his business along thoroughly progressive lines, was ever reliable in his dealings and his enterprising spirit constituted the basis of his constantly growing success, enabling him in time to retire from active life with a substantial competence.

Mr. Luckey has been married twice. He first wedded Elizabeth Stewart, a daughter of Eben Stewart, of Eugene. For his second wife he chose Jennie Spencer, of Lane county, who was a daughter of Septimus Spencer, a native of St. Charles county, Missouri, and a representative of an old English family that had been founded in America for several generations. Mr. and Mrs. Luckey are members of the Episcopal Church and are interested in all those forces which work for the up building and development of the community along material, intellectual and moral lines. Fraternally Mr. Luckey is connected with Spencer-Butte Lodge, I. O.O.F. He also belongs to Helmet Lodge, No. 33 K. P. and to Eugene Lodge, No. 357, B. P.O. E. In politics he is a republican and while never a politician in the sense of the office seeker, he has served for one term as a member of the city council and for one term as county treasurer, discharging the duties of these positions in a prompt, capable and businesslike manner which won for him the commendation of all concerned. He is a lover of good books and has always been a great reader. He is domestic in his taste, finding his greatest happiness in his own home rather than in public life, yet he is never neglectful of his duties of citizenship and his aid and cooperation can always be counted upon to further any movement for the public good." 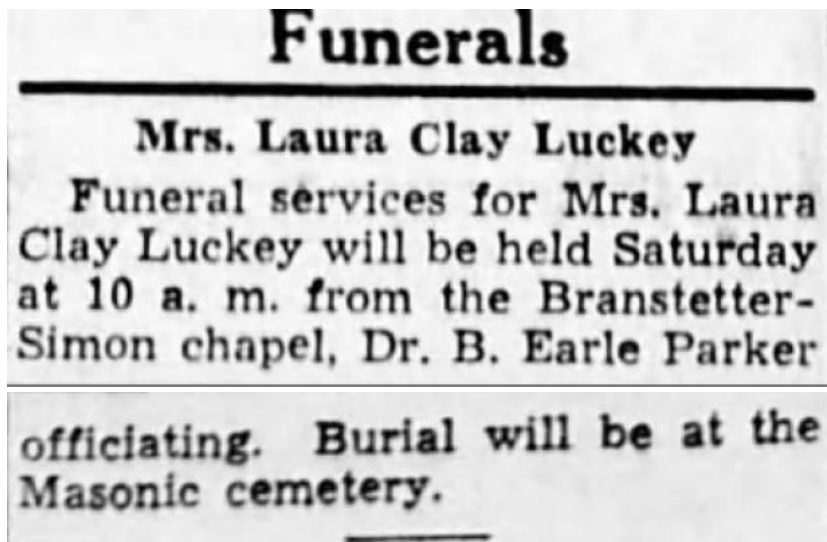

Then, for the first and only time, the Crooked river and Antelope ranchers held a roundup which took in this territory. One hundred men gathered together the cattle on the Deschutes range, and along with the Deschutes cattle and a few wearing the brands of the Antelope and Crooked river ranches, they found 40 "brons," as unbranded cattle were called here. The ranchers at the roundup decided to sell the brons and divide the proceeds. This did not at all suit the Deschutes ranchers, for they knew that a large percentage of the calves and yearlings were theirs; but because they were in the minority and because of the factional trouble, they kept silent. Gene Luckey, then a rider for Brumen and Summerville, bought most of the brons at a very favorable price, and started the brand which later made him a fortune. He went from Central Oregon to Eugene, and later disappeared.
