#### MISSION STATEMENT



# Ghost Towns Celebration Saturday, June 18

Brooks Historical is delighted to feature Steve Arndt, local author of "Oregon Ghost Towns from A to Z", and the "Roads Less Traveled Oregon" book series at our annual BHS Celebration, on Saturday, June 18.

The program begins at 10 am with a series of short talks by BHS members on ghost communities of our French Prairie and Howell Prairie area. Featured communities are Fairfield, Parkersville, Waconda, North Howell/Laurence, Labish Center, Deweyville and St. Louis.

This will be followed by a noon potluck lunch, with cake, beverages and tableware provided.



After lunch, Steve Arndt will give a presentation based on his Ghost Towns books.

Old time music will be provided as you browse the Brooks Depot Museum source materials on

local ghost communities, and the books, including Mr. Arndt's books, offered for sale.

Please bring your own stories to share, and any memorabilia about communities long gone, but not yet forgotten. Potluck lunch. Entrance fee \$6, under 12 free.

# Signs to be Placed



As part of the Ghost Towns Celebration, Brooks Historical will purchase brown and white signs from Marion County to be placed at the site of six ghost communities in our area. The signs are 36 x 30 inches.

The six signs will be Fairfield, Parkersville, Waconda (new only), North Howell/Laurence, Labish Center, and Deweyville. We will not include St. Louis as there is already a sign there.

This APMA exhibit in the Dezotell building at Antique Powerland includes information and old photos of the Oregon Electric and the Southern Pacific Railways. They brought many of the first black workers to the Willamette Valley.

Note especially the baggage cart in the exhibit which was used in the Brooks Depot during the Depot's working days, from 1900 to 1960. The cart may be offered to BHS when the exhibit ends in July.


# The Great Train Wreck of 1890

From Lake Labish: Early Landowners and Events, by the Sons of Labish. (available for sale at the Brooks Depot)

On November 12, 1980 a Southern Pacific train was crossing a trestle on the lake bottom (Lake Labish) at about 8:15 pm and for some unknown reason the engineer firmly applied the air brakes on the train.

This trestle was known to be in poor condition and the sudden braking made the trestle collapse, causing the engine and the three cars to fall 16 feet into the marsh, killing the engineer, at least two more men and injuring many more.





.The three cars were salvaged, but because the engine was so heavy, it sank deep into the muck soil and they were unable to salvage it. In order to get the railroad back and running, they built a dirt fill across this part of the trestle, which covered the engine completely.


