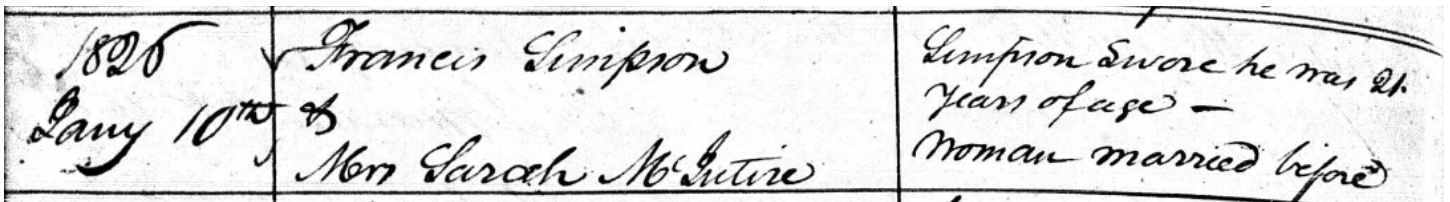

DEATH OF A PIONEER.

Horace J. McIntire, Who Came to Oregon in 1850.

In the death of Horace J. McIntire, which occurred in Portland June 26, Oregon has lost another of its pioneer citizens. At the time of his death he was 77 years 10 months and 7 days old. He first came to this state in the fall of 1850, and settled at Sauvie's island, where, up to the past 10 years, he almost constantly resided.

He was born in Kentucky in 1820, and 20 years later, with his parents, moved to the state of Missouri. In 1842 he married Narcissa M. E. Miller. Joining an emigrant train in the spring of 1850, they accomplished the long and hazardous journey across the plains, arriving at The Dalles during the fall of the same year. The journey to Portland was made in canoes and batteaux. Soon after a permanent residence was established at Sauvie's island and he engaged in stock-raising.

Mrs. McIntire died 11 years ago, and since that time Mr. McIntire has resided principally in Portland. He leaves eight sons and daughters—six children of the family having died. Those living are: John and R. E., Portland; W. P. and Mrs. N. W. McCoy, Cathlamet, Wash.; James and Mrs. Emma Henrici, Sauvie's island; Mrs. Kitty Hutchenson, Highland, Clackamas county, Or., and Mrs. Nora McCullum, Stella, Wash.

JOHN M'INTYRE, PIONEER RIVER MASTER, DEAD

A link with the past was broken this morning when Captain John M. McIntire, who crossed the plains in 1850, and who was a pioneer logger and steamboat man of the Oregon country, died at his home, No. 2545 Sandy boulevard.

Captain McIntire sailed as a youth on the Cowlitz river under the noted Captain Joseph Kellogg, in the early '70s, and in later years plied his own boats on the Columbia and Willamette rivers.

He was born in 1846, in Missouri, crossing the plains with his father, Horace J. McIntire, when 4 years old. The family settled on Sauvies' island, which was young McIntire's home until he was 18 years old, when he ventured into the then booming Southern Oregon country. There he met and married Amy Jones, in Jacksonville, in 1869.

After a few years he returned to Portland. In 1875 he became interested in logging on the lower Columbia, his first camp being at Nampa. Shoalwater bay, later called Willapa harbor, became the center of his activities in 1887. In 1891 he went to Cascade Locks, where he remained until the locks were completed, some five years later.

After that he engaged in steamboating and general contracting until 1911, when he retired. *

The first Mrs. McIntire died in 1900 and the captain married again in 1905. Mrs. McIntire survives him.

The last boat operated by Captain McIntire was the Monarch, in which he had a half interest. It ran excursions to Cascade Locks and carried material for Monarch mills. The captain was one of the organizers of the Western Transportation company.

The following children survive: Mrs. Mae Simpson, Massett, B. C.; Dr. N. Eugenia Barney, Sterling, Cal.; Mrs. Edith M. Ebell, Baker; Mrs. Ruby C. Hybe, Shanghai, China, and Mrs. Rilla P. Musanpe, Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be Wednesday at Finley's chapel, the exact hour to be announced later.

Mrs. Mae Simpson, the captain's oldest daughter, is the wife of Eugene Simpson, son of Oregon's poet, Sam Simpson.

McINTIRE FUNERAL SET

LUMBERMAN, SHIPPER TO BE BURIED TOMORROW.

Pioneer Operated on Lower River Many Years and Later On at Cascade Locks.

Funeral services for Captain John M. McIntire, steamboat operator and logger of the early Oregon days, will be held at Finley chapel tomorrow at 10:30 o'clock.

Captain McIntire was born in Missouri in 1846, and as a youth of 4, crossed the plains with his father, Horace J. McIntire. The family settled on Sauvie's island which was young McIntire's home until he was 18 years old, when the boom in southern Oregon attracted him to that region. There he met and married Amy Jones of Jacksonville in 1869.

Returning to Portland a few years later, he became interested in logging on the lower Columbia river, his first camp being at Knappa. In 1887 he moved his operations to Shoalwater bay, later called Willapa harbor. In 1891 he moved to Cascade Locks, where he made his home until the locks were completed five years later. He then entered the steamboat business with which he was associated until his retirement in 1911.

The last boat operated by Captain McIntire was the Monarch, in which he owned a half interest. It ran excursions to Cascade Locks and transported material for the Monarch mills. The captain was one of the founders of the Western Transportation company.

Mr. McIntire's first wife died in 1900, and in 1905 he married again, his widow surviving him. The following children survive: Mrs. Mae Simpson of Masset, B. C.; Mrs. Edith M. Ebell of Baker, Or.; Mrs. Ruby C. Hybe of Shanghai, China; Mrs. Rilla P. Musante of Los Angeles; A. F. McIntire of St. Helens, and George W. McIntire of Portland.

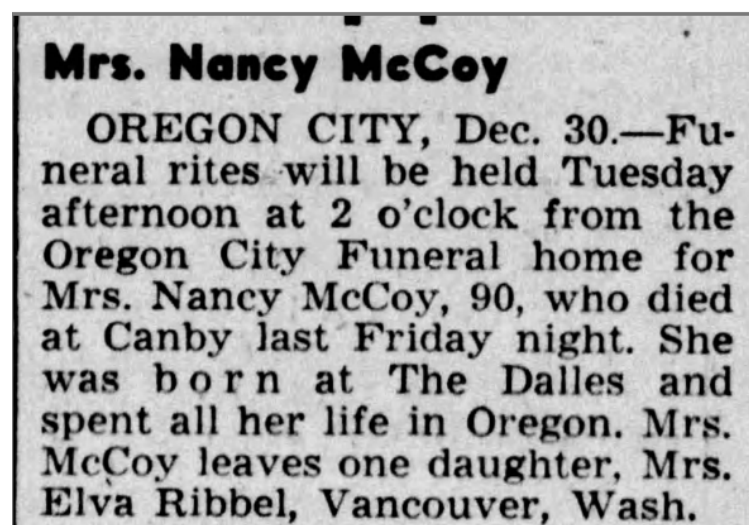

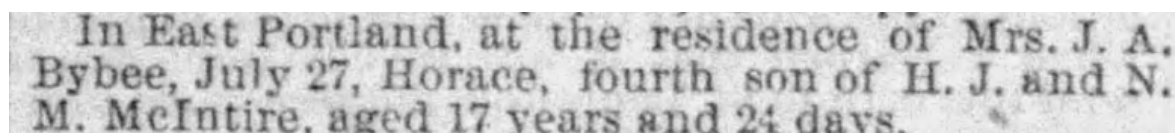

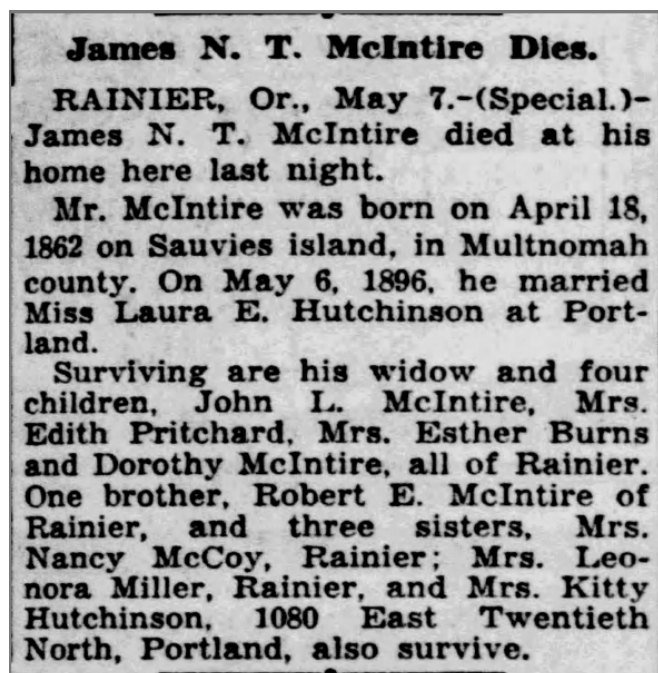
